For this exercise you can use your calculator or Pari-GP for basic arithmetic modulo 13 but not for more advanced calculations.

- 1. Verify that $P_A = (837670, 538535)$ is on the circle $C: x^2 + y^2 = 1$ over \mathbb{F}_p for p = 1000003. Solve the discrete logarithm problem with base point P = (1000, 2), i.e., find an integer $0 \le a with <math>P_A = aP$.
 - For this exercise you should use some computer algebra system, e.g. https://www.sagemath.org/. Hand in your program code along with the solution. 7 points
- 2. Show that (0,1) is the neutral element with respect to the addition law on an Edwards curve, i.e., that P + (0,1) = (0,1) + P = P for any point P on $E: x^2 + y^2 = 1 + dx^2y^2$. Then show that (0,-1) has order 2 and that $(\pm 1,0)$ have order 4.
- 3. Show that points of the form $(\pm b, \pm b)$ on $x^2 + y^2 = 1 + dx^2y^2$ have order 8 if they exist. **Hints:**
 - Show that they double to a point of order 4, then argue that this implies order 8.
 - Make sure to check that your denominators are nonzero.
